1 **18th**

Whether it's the early 1920s or fast forward to now, if you are in KC and looking for a good time, you'd make your way to the historic _____.

KC's black yard bird is perched here, signifying the American jazz spirit proudly blowing his sax. Do you hear it?

3 

Originally located in Trenton behind her owner's home, the foundation of Lucy's pride is now here so the legacy can be known.

4 

Hovering over the Diamond, KC's royal currency welcomes all visitors to remember a time when ebony and ivory were separated by the vine.

5 

Home to a rarity in 1950, this is where African American women became pioneers within their industry, and Lucille became the voice of African American civil liberty.

Colored Girl Millionaire owning land that gushed with gold, this woman's home should be a KC monument for all African American #girlboss goals.

7 

A meal fit for any president, whether it's the burnt ends, a slab of ribs, or just the condiments, The Strut Man welcomes you at the entrance.

With even the hint of the richness of melanin in the skin, this was the only hospital in Kansas City they were accepted in.

From 1832-1865, on one of KC's largest plantations bordered what we now know as the Troost Divide. Making their way from 23rd to a little past 31st, slaves quenched their thirst here.

Where old Byram's Ford Road and Hardesty meet, this was a spot during the Battle of Westport where Confederates would retreat.

A quick jump across where the great Missouri runs, the first freeport where slaves had a chance to see an American sun.

Still a favorite Irish pub nestled in the heart of the town, history was not so kind for the slaves once housed underground.

Homerun streaks painted red, yellow, and blue, baseball runs through their heritage, through and through.
